IRVING TOWNSHIP BOARD MEETING

3425 Wing Road, Hastings, MI 49058

September 21, 2021

Meeting called to order: 6:30 pm

Present: Sharon Olson-Clerk, Alesse Cross-Treasurer, Jamie Knight-Supervisor, Dean Bass-Trustee, Mike Buehler,

Trustee. Seventeen (17) members of the public were also present.

Knight, thank you for attending. Before we approve the agenda, **under new business**, I would like to discuss the Birch Ambulance Service that Birch has been talking about. Any other corrections or additions? **Knight**, motion to approve agenda with addition of new business, Birch Ambulance. All in favor, "Aye". Motion passed.

Reports: Assessor, Hastings Fire and Thornapple Fire read and attached. Freeport Fire report read by Jim Yarger. In addition, verbal recognition for 23 years of service, Lani Forbes. Cemetery update by Sharon Olson, nine (9) lots sold.

Commissioner's report, Smelker, we reviewed the 911 punch list with our director, Stephanie Lehman. She will go through the punch list with the construction company to determine if there is anything else that needs to be done so that we can get this buttoned up. The job is about done. Courts and Law, they demoed the first floor. Basement is done, except for flooring. We cannot get any carpet in until the 28th of October. First floor they demoed. They are putting up studs, drywall and electric.

They have had meetings on redistricting. They have been talking about and have drawn up maps. There will be public input at a later date. They told me, possibly, my district will be Irving and the north part Thornapple. They will take Rutland and Carlton away from me because they are going to go to eight (8) commissioners.

We had quite a meeting today on the mask mandate. Well over 250 people came for public input. **Knight**, any decisions on that? Is there anything that you can do as commissioners? **Smelker**, we have a health board meeting this Thursday. I am not sure where. I am sure there will be plenty of public input. My stance is that we do not need a mask mandate. I know there are people who disagree with me, and that is fine. We will see if there is anything that we can do. We will talk with Collet on Thursday. Financials at 9:00 am, discussion at 9:30 am. Location to be determined.

Knight, at this point, do we have any public input? Please come to the podium and state your name. Rachel Frantz, Recycling Coordinator, recycle@barrycounty.org. I just presented at the Board of Commissioners this morning. I am visiting all the local townships in Barry County to introduce myself to make myself available to discuss recycling. I just created a map showing all recycling opportunities available. It can be found at www.barrycountyrecycles.org. You can watch video that was presented at the same website. Frantz, my goal is really to start a conversation about recycling and how we can do more.

Forbes, L thanked the township for their letter of support for the ARPA Funds. The Village of Freeport requested \$839,000 for the water tower and the water looping of the mains. The total cost of the project is over \$1,000,000. We will use our funds and as Bill mentioned before, we will request matching funds from Irving and Carlton for Village of Freeport Water Tower.

Yarger, Dana, Barry County Medical Control, provided a handout detailing how the various EMS agencies in Barry County are doing, a report card. Any medical agency that operates in Barry County, we track their quality. We are the authority in Barry County that oversees the EMS. We are the medical control quality with the hospital. We are here to partner with you.

Brown, **Jim**, President Hastings Charter, regarding the number of commissioners that we need, taking the data from the last census, (3) townships make up over 50% increase of the entire county, Irving, Thornapple and Yankee Springs.

Several years ago, we went from eight (8) to seven (7) commissioners. However, today, the whole population is changing. We could use eight (8) commissioners. When you put the Village of Middleville and Freeport Village in that mix, it changes even more. We need eight (8) commissioners.

Brown, Jim, regarding Rachael Frantz, Barry County Recycles, is doing a very good job as recycling coordinator. I like working with her. Now that we have someone, I think you will see a lot more good things happen. If anybody can make it happen, she can.

Knight, any other public input, hearing NONE. We will move on to the Minutes of August 17. Any changes or corrections? **Knight,** Motion to approve Minutes of August 17, seconded by **Cross, A.** All in favor, "Aye.

Cross, A, Treasurer Report, a summary was presented and is attached.

Monthly Bills, board members reviewed the list. Knight, Motion to approve the bills of \$15,591.26, seconded by Bass. All in favor, "Aye." Roll call – YES – Buehler, Cross, Olsen, Knight, Bass.

Board Member Comments, none.

Knight, Unfinished Business. Bass, railing update. Unable to get anyone to bid. The people he spoke to were too busy, too small of job. Knight, Lorraine, Sharon's deputy, has a quote from Eric Mahler Remolding. The bid: to remove, replace, repaint, 18' of railing, (confirmed steel) that is broken with new OSHA approved handrail for \$2,600, the area in front of door. Knight, any thoughts? Bass, considering the time constraints to get this done and the difficulty to find anyone ... Buehler, sounds pricey. Knight, I don't know if we can find anyone else. You (Buehler) said you had someone; however, they are a couple months out. Buehler, right. Olsen, we are not at a maintenance stage. I believe we need to take care of fixing it. Knight, Motion to approve Eric Mahler Remodeling, amount \$2600, Cross, seconded. All in favor, "Aye." Roll call – YES – Buehler, Cross, Olsen, Knight, Bass.

New Business, Knight, contract received from Skyline Gutter Systems for Snowplowing Services. Same provider as in the past. Contract for 2021/2022, same prices as 2020/2021, see attached. **Knight,** Motion to approve 2021/2022 contract with Skyline Gutter Systems, seconded by **Buehler.** Roll call – YES – **Buehler, Cross, Olsen, Knight, Bass.** Motion passed.

Knight, I have received phone calls from several residents regarding the letter from Mercy Ambulance letter that Jim Brown brought to the board last month. I gave everybody a copy of that letter. Just for your reference, I provided a map of ambulance service line. Yarger, has provided county numbers, Mercy, and Thornapple. Knight, at this point, I would like to have an open conversation with the public in attendance, though it is not open discussion, to discuss concerns and present them to the Board. Is there anyone who would like to speak on this? Knight, one concern that Mercy is a forprofit ambulance company. Mercy is asking for a five-year contract. Buehler, besides Mercy, what other ambulance services are there? Knight, I have talked to Randy Eaton, Thornapple Fire Chief, and they would be happy to cover that area. A participant mentioned that they lived in that area and that they may be better served by Thornapple. Knight, I know Randy I asked for run numbers. I printed off the worksheet. Knight, Jim, a new contract has not been signed for the Birch/Mercy ambulance, correct? Jim, right and that is why we are here. We have a contract for the next 9 months. Knight as a board to consider having Thornapple take over that section of ambulance runs that Mercy/Birch covers. Knight, open for board member discussion. Smelker, I am not a board member, but this is for Randy Eaton, how many rigs are your running? And would you put on more rigs if you needed? Eaton, yes. We are at one. We can put on a second one with paid on-call staff. Olson, do we know how much this will cost? Eaton, I do not have those numbers on such short notice. Smelker, what cost increase? Olson, there would be a cost increase to us. Brown to Eaton, are you interested in covering the entire area for ambulance? Eaton, yes. Knight, any other public input. Rodney Palmer, Mercy Ambulance Service, thank you I have been doing this since 1980. I can see where this is heading for your township. Regardless, we all do work together. Anyway, I wanted you to know taking your 64 runs and does have some impact on us. I just wanted to make sure that you know I am here to help. You can reach to me for questions after.

Conclusion: Mercy is asking for a subsidy that is necessary to offset the rise of cost of service. Thornapple Township Emergency services was asked to provide a cost assessment as well to cover an area outlined on the map that would affect some citizens in Irving Township. The ambulance contract expires June 2022. The board will review proposals at the December 21, Board Meeting.

Knight, our next Hastings/Birch meeting is Wednesday, September 29, at 6:30 pm at Hastings Charter Township. Dean and I are the delegates to seat on the Birch Board. Dean can attend, but I am not. I would like to appoint Larry Brummel to attend and vote in my place for that meeting. Knight, Motion to allow Larry Brummel to attend Hastings/Birch meeting representing Knight, Wednesday, September 29. Seconded by Buehler. All in favor "Aye". Opposed, none.

Knight, any other public input. Hearing none. Our next meeting is October 19, at 6:30 pm.

Knight, Motion to adjourn meeting at 7:20 pm, seconded by Cross. Motion passed.
