September 11, 2024 will be the 23rd Anniversary of the deadliest terrorist attack in history taking the lives of 2,977, and injuring thousands more. Among those killed were 343 fire-fighters and 71 law enforcement officers, 55 military personnel and 1 fish and wildlife officer. The immensity of the tragedy often causes the fact that approximately 15,400 people were successfully evacuated from the towers before they collapsed, a credit to the first responder's actions. September 11 was a test of the American Spirit, most people old enough to remember can tell you exactly what they were doing when they heard the news. Patriot Day, September 11, is remembrance of those we lost, flags should be flown at half-staff and a moment of silence should be observed at 8:46 Eastern, which is the time American Airlines Flight **11** hit the north tower.
